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Homework Policy

This policy outlines the expectations for homework across Welbourne Primary Academy, detailing what each Key Stage and Year Group can expect. It has been designed to enable opportunities for pre-teaching (revisiting previously learnt objectives in preparation for new objectives) and consolidation (revision of newly learnt objectives).

Wider Curriculum		A project will be given related to what the children are learning about in the Wider Curriculum, provided by Curriculum Maestro. Children will be expected to complete the project throughout the term.	
Reading	<p>Children are expected to read their reading book for 5 minutes each night.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Time should be spent discussing the book. • Children will have the opportunity to change their book once a week. <p>Parents should record and sign all instances of reading that take place at home.</p>	<p>Children are expected to read their reading book for 10 minutes each night.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Time should be spent discussing the book e.g. literal and inferential style questioning. • Children will have the opportunity to change their book twice a week. <p>Parents should record and sign all instances of reading that take place at home.</p>	<p>Children are expected to read their reading book for 15 minutes each night.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If children do not manage it one night, they should read extra pages on other nights. • Children should read aloud to an adult during the week where possible to support their development of reading fluency and expression. <p>Parents or children can record instances of reading at home but must still be signed off by an adult.</p>
English	A piece of English related to letter formation or writing the CVC words the children are learning will be provided. sounds	A piece of SPAG (spelling, punctuation & Grammar) or phonics will be sent home each week, recapping what the children have learnt in class.	Two pieces of SPAG (spelling, punctuation & Grammar) or reading will be set on Century each week, one piece will recap what the children have learnt in class and the other piece will be an opportunity for pre-learning.

Maths	A piece of mathematics will be provided related to number formation or counting.	A piece of Mathematics will be sent home each week, recapping what the children have learnt in class. These activities could be written activities or practical activities.	Two pieces of mathematics will be set on Century each week, one piece will recap what the children have learnt in class and the other piece will be an opportunity for pre-learning.		
Timestables		Please help the children learn to quickly recall multiplication and division facts.			
		Year 1 Times tables Children to start to count in 2s, 5s and 10s, exploring relationships between these numbers.	Year 2 Times tables children will move on to learning 2s, 5s and 10s exploring relationships between these numbers.	Year 3 Children will move on to their 3s, 4s, 8s and 11 times tables.	Year 4 Children are expected to know all their times tables up to 12x12.

- Children who do not complete their homework will be reminded of the importance and encouraged to complete it.
- For children in Key Stage 2, who do not have access to the internet at home a homework club will be provided on a weekly basis.
