We promote children's mental health in a number of ways, including:

- Teaching pupils about their emotions and how to manage them.
- Providing opportunities for pupils to talk about their feelings and experiences.
- Providing support for pupils who are struggling with their mental health.

A young person may be a young carer for a number of different reasons and who they care for and the support they provide is unique to their family situation.
