Behaviour

At the start of this term, we had a really successful training day in which we updated our behaviour policy as we strive for Welbourne to have the best learning environment possible. As part of the updated behaviour policy, we have introduced the idea of having a behaviour curriculum, which we thoroughly researched. The idea of a behaviour curriculum is where we explicitly teach children the routines and expectations of the school.

We have split the routines and expectations that are being taught into five areas:

- Always—What we expect the children of Welbourne Primary Academy to always do.
- In our learning zones—What we expect when they are learning.
- On the school grounds—What we expect from children when they are around school.
- In the community—How the children should act in the community.
- When using technology—How children behave when they are online.

We have introduced the behaviour curriculum to support all the children of Welbourne Primary Academy to strive in school, in their community and in their future lives.

Year 3 Flag Fen Visit

Year 3 visited Flag Fen to learn about The Stone Age. They experienced building shelters using the wattle and daub technique which involved getting very messy, as well as creating pottery using techniques brought to England by The Beaker Folk. They practiced their rock painting skills using materials such as raspberries and crushed up charcoal. After this, they took aim and practiced throwing a speer to experience how individuals during the Stone Age would hunt and gather. At the end of the trip, they enjoyed a fire in a traditional Neolithic roundhouse.
