A note from Miss Lawson

Welcome back to the start of the summer term which promises to be another fulfilled term with (hopefully) lots of nice weather.

We are now fully prepared for the upcoming SATs tests with Year 6 and Year 2 being tested in English and Maths, Year 4 in multiplication tables and Year 1 in Phonics. Should you require any further information on what the tests will involve, please be in touch with your child's class teacher.

Within our values and school rules work this term we will be focusing on how to solve a conflict. We have discussed what the term conflict means and how resolving a conflict is an important life skill. We have looked at what may cause a conflict which includes:

- *different beliefs
- *stubbornness—struggling to see things from someone else's point of view
- *past arguments that haven't been resolved

We have identified how we need to listen to other people when we have a conflict , compromise and have empathy. We have also discussed how a conflict can be different to bullying and so we are fully equipped to deal with each situation.

Miss Plastow is working extremely hard to promote our positive playtimes and provide the children with exciting opportunities on the playground. Safeguarding and Signposting

Safeguarding is about keeping children safe from harm, abuse, and neglect. As a school, we have a legal and moral responsibility to ensure that every child is safe and well cared for.

To fulfil this responsibility, we have procedures we follow to ensure the safety of all children. Safeguarding covers a range of areas: child protection, online safety, and health and safety. Mr Hurford is our designated safeguarding lead (DSL) and Miss Lawson and Mrs Rudd are the Deputies. All three are responsible for overseeing safeguarding and have received specialist training. The school has clear procedures in place for responding to any concerns that may arise about a child's welfare. If a member of staff or parent has any concerns about a child's welfare, they will report it to Mr Hurford immediately.

It is essential that we work together and support each other as a school community to ensure that every child is safe and protected. I urge all parents to report any concerns they may have promptly.

As part of the role as DSL, Mr Hurford has created a Parent Signposting Document that will be emailed to you all. This document signposts parents and carers to external agencies, who can offer specialist support.

Kings Coronation

On Friday 5th of May we will be inviting your children to come dressed in red, white and blue to celebrate the Kings Coronation. Each class will be learning all about the Coronation and completing Coronation activities in the afternoon that will also involve party food and games. It is sure to be a day that the children remember!



Year 3 Trip to Wrest Park

The children had a visit to Wrest Park as an introduction to their studies around life in ancient Rome. The children learnt about the history and structure of ancient Rome and the Roman Empire, including a detailed exploration of the Romanisation of Britain. They also explored aspects of everyday life for the Romans including looking at exhibits and artefacts from the Roman era".
