## Reading for Pleasure

This week your child will bring home two reading books. One text will be a book that has been chosen from our reading programme and the other text will be from the class library. It is important that we read stories to children that are beyond the level that they can read for themselves so that they experience the joy of listening to a range of stories, non-fiction and poetry. The expectation is that children will read every night, ideally to an adult so that the children can practise a range of skills that they have learnt in school. This could be decoding the words on the page, reading fluently and with expression or summarising what they have read. Each time your child reads at home this should be recorded in their reading record by either a parent/carer or older children may want to write their own annotations with a parent signature by the end of the week. This will then be recorded in class and prizes will be awarded as milestones are met.



## 300 year celebration—'Acts of Kindness'

In 1721 Thomas Deacon died, leaving his legacy in his will to set up and fund a school in Peterborough. This became Deacon's charity school, opening in 1722 to 20 pupils. TDET is now a partnership of seven academies, educating over 5,000 children and young people in Peterborough and the surrounding areas. As part of TDET and to celebrate 300 years we are recognising our own 'Act of Kindness' just like the selfless act of Thomas Deacon. #### Year 3 Trip to Flag Fen

Year 3 had an amazing day out at Flag Fen on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> October, as part of our topic called 'Through the Ages' where we were learning about British prehistory from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. We found out about how the people in our local area lived, and realised how hard it was to survive, and how they had to depend on each other to do this. We learnt about how people had to catch, grow, and make everything for themselves and how as a race we evolved over time. We learnt to build our own shelter using the wattle and daub technique, learning how to weave willow, and mixing mud, clay, straw, manure, and water to hold it all together. It was very messy, but we worked as a team and had so much fun!

We learnt how to hunt down a deer for food, as well as understanding how every part of the animal was used. We all managed to stab the straw deer with a spear, so we know we could have survived!
